Project DeLorean has purchased approximately 47 acres in Millersburg, and plans on investing an estimated \$257 million in a new facility, property improvements and equipment.

They have completed an Enterprise Zone Certification Application for the Long-Term Rural Tax Incentive dated October 21, 2024.

Summary of the Agreement terms; 10 year exemption period, \$257 million investment, 108 new jobs, pay wages and benefits in excess of 150% of Linn County's Average Annual Wage, pay School Support Fee, pay the City of Millersburg a Public Safety Fee, pay Linn County a Public Safety Fee.

Attached is a draft resolution which approves the Long-Term Rural Enterprise Zone Abatement and Agreement. Each co-sponsor, County and City, needs to pass a resolution.

CLTLab is acquiring approximately 34 acres (of 56 acres) in Millersburg, and plans on investing an estimated \$122 million in a new facility, property improvements and equipment.

They have completed an Enterprise Zone Certification Application for the Long-Term Rural Tax Incentive dated October 29, 2024.

Summary of the Agreement terms; 15 year exemption period, \$122 million investment, 75 new jobs, pay wages and benefits in excess of 150% of Linn County's Average Annual Wage, pay School Support Fee, pay the City of Millersburg a Public Safety Fee, pay Linn County a Public Safety Fee.

LCSO: EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT 2024 Program Review

Summary: In 2024, the Linn County Emergency Management Program continued to evolve and adapt to emerging challenges and opportunities in disaster preparedness and response. This review provides a comprehensive overview of the program's performance throughout the year, highlighting key activities, accomplishments, and areas for improvement. By examining the effectiveness of our Emergency Operations Center (EOC) activations and incident responses, grant management practices, preparedness activities, and exercises, we aim to ensure that our county remains resilient and well-prepared to handle emergencies and disasters.

Incident Response & EOC Activations: This section reviews the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) activation during 2024, detailing the types and scales of incidents that triggered EOC involvement. It includes an analysis of response efficiency, coordination with other agencies, and any lessons learned from these activations. Critical incidents and their impact on the community are discussed, along with the effectiveness of communication and resource management during these events.

1. January 2024 Winter Storm

- Overview: Between January 9th and 19th, a strong winter storm affected Linn County, causing icy roads, downed trees, and widespread power outages. The Winter Storm was the first time EOC staff used their new EOC software, which was found to be effective and enhanced coordination and information.
- O Actions Taken: The EOC was preemptively activated before the storm hit, and they worked with state and local partners to prepare. The EOC provided stakeholders with daily updates on conditions and outages. The EOC issued a Linn Benton Alert in Sweet Home due to a request by SHFD because strong winds and debris blocked access for first responders. The EOC coordinated a call center that used vulnerable population data to contact vulnerable populations to ensure they had adequate resources and supplies. Linn County GIS developed a survey that allowed call takers to track any needs or requests through welfare checks.
- Clessons Learned: A need was identified for more support from Linn County Health Services related to medical resource coordination and welfare phone calls. SAR volunteers operated the call center. Initially, SAR was needed for door-to-door status checks in Idanah, but weather conditions improved, and the door-to-door checks were not needed, allowing SAR to operate the call center. Additionally, using FEMA 214s during the incident would have helped streamline the reporting of damage and cost assessments for

reimbursement.

- Recovery: Linn County Emergency Management, in partnership with Linn County GIS, developed a digital FEMA 214 form to track damages, personnel, and equipment costs. This tool enabled Linn County to qualify for federal assistance. Oregon was issued a Presidential Disaster declaration and has several projects open for reimbursement.
- 2. Linn County Fair 2024: The Linn County Sheriff's Office set up a mobile command post at the Linn County Fair. Due to the variety of resources available at the Fair, Linn County Emergency Management developed a daily event action plan. The plan contained vital contact info between Law Enforcement, Security, EMS/Fire, and Event Staff. The command post and plan helped mitigate issues and enabled an organized and coordinated effort for immediate needs. During the Fair, several wildfires started, and EOC staff operated out of the mobile command post and managed both the Fair and the initial Pyramid Fire Response.

3. Fire Season 2024

- Overview: The 2024 fire season started earlier than expected, starting in July with the Pyramid and Ore Fires and at the same time the Linn County Fair started. This year's fire season involved coordination with several partner organizations and stakeholders.
- Actions Taken: The Linn County Sheriff's Office utilized the Incident Command System and integrated with State and Federal Incident Management Teams. Emergency Management staff coordinated and assisted with appropriate forest closures and evacuation levels. Mountain Patrol Deputies and SAR volunteers evacuated popular recreation areas (campsites, roads, and trails). Emergency Management staff sent out situation reports to partner organizations. Additionally, Linn County provided mutual to Lane County for the Linton and Boulder Creek Fires. The County Emergency Manager worked with the Forest Service Agency Administrator to develop an appropriate fire closure area. SAR members were again utilized to clear trails and recreation areas. The Linn County Emergency Manager also filled in as a Type 3 Deputy Plans Chief under the Incident Command System during the Bingham fire the USFS did not have adequate staffing to fill the role internally.
- Lessons Learned: This year's fire season had more resources deployed in Oregon than the 2020 fires. The early start drained resources across the state. Linn County SAR took on many of the trail evacuation roles from the Forest Service due to low staffing. SAR identified a need for proper fire PPE and training for future evacuations in a level 3. SAR across Oregon is increasingly utilized during fires, yet funding streams for equipment and training are only available for recognized fire departments. A positive lesson learned is that Life Flight and the IMTs can provide air insertions and extractions for trail evacuations if aircraft are available. This resource increased the safety and response time of critical evacuation needs. Additionally, using a mobile Star Link unit increased interoperability and communication from command and teams in the field. An area needing improvement is the County's trunked radio network. Expansion/new sites are needed along Highway 20 east of Cascadia. Command set up a radio relay on top of Hoodoo for the Pyramid fire evacuations, which was successful in keeping communication with the evacuation teams.
- Recovery: There are no planned disaster declarations for Linn County as these fires have had minimal impact on private and public infrastructure. Private timber was affected, but the losses have not yielded the threshold for a declaration.

Grant Management: The County Emergency Management Program applied for and managed several existing grant funding streams. Below is a summary of each grant program.

- 1. **Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG)** This grant initially brought in \$88,000. Due to surplus funds, we received an additional \$10,000. This grant helps cover the staffing costs for Emergency Management staff.
- 2. **State Homeland Security Grant** Projects have been approved, but funds are still pending. This grant is funding critical radio infrastructure upgrades for emergency services. Additionally, we submitted a project for a surveillance trailer to help with security at large county events like the Fair.
- 3. State Preparedness and Incident Response Grant (SPIRE) Two projects approved in 2022, a new mobile command trailer and a communications trailer. The communication trailer started production this summer. The command trailer is still under the procurement and contract phase.
- 4. **FEMA DR 4768 (Winter Storm Recovery Grant)** Linn County Emergency Management assisted Linn County Parks with the FEMA damage assessment process and determined that the Parks Dept is available for recovery funds due to damages from the storm. Additionally, other cities and fire districts in Linn County are also eligible for funding due to the County Emergency Managements damage assessment work with FEMA.
- 5. **D4H Incident Management** This is a grant through the company D4H. Because much of Linn County Emergency Management and SAR overlap, we were eligible for a grant that discounts the cost of incident management software because we are a volunteer-run program. The new software has been instrumental during EOC operations.

Preparedness Initiatives 2024: Linn County Emergency Management participated in several preparedness initiatives. Below is a list and summary.

- 1. January Career Day presentation at South Albany High School and social media campaign about upcoming winter weather.
- 2. February Emergency preparedness presentation for OSU emergency vet staff.
- 3. March Test of Linn Benton Alert system; social media posts leading up to the test encouraged residents to sign up.
- 4. May -
 - Due to Wildfire Awareness Month, a social media campaign on wildfire preparedness was released.
 - Memorial Day weekend: Preventative SAR and wildfire safety event. During this event, SAR and CERT volunteers' pre-stage at popular recreation spots (Clear Lake, Blue Pool, and Sahalie Falls) to give out wildfire and hiker safety information.
- 5. **June** Public meeting showcasing the 2023 response to the Wiley Fire and the importance of preparedness for wildfire season.
- 6. **July** Preparedness booth at the Linn County Fair. Linn County Planning and Building conducted a hazard assessment survey of attendees.
- 7. August
 - Preparedness booth with Linn County Health Services at the Albany Art and Air Festival.
 - Labor Day Weekend (08/31) preventative SAR and wildfire safety event.

8. **September** – Public presentation on preparedness to the Lebanon Optimist Club with CERT. Social media campaign for preparedness month.

9. October –

- Preparedness booth at the Lebanon Community Appreciation Day with CERT.
- Linn Benton ALERT test.
- 10. **November** Preparedness booth at the Albany Veterans Day Parade (tentative).

Training and Exercise: This section provides an overview of the emergency management training and exercises conducted in 2024. It includes details on the types of exercises, their objectives, and participation levels. The evaluation covers how these exercises tested our emergency plans and procedures, identified gaps, and contributed to improving our overall emergency management strategies.

Exercises:

- May Jamboree Table-Top Exercise: In coordination with FEMA, the County Emergency Manager facilitated an exercise for Jamboree event organizers, Sweet Home Fire District, and Sweet Home Police Department. The exercise tested the staff's ability to manage an incident within an incident. A gap was identified as federal partners from CISA used to provide surveillance trailers and security support. That capability is no longer offered, so a grant was submitted to acquire that equipment for a variety of events in Linn County.
- July LEPC ATI Hazmat Functional Exercise The Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) facilitated a hazardous materials release exercise in Albany. The exercise tested the interoperability between the City and County EOC staff. The city determined that it should adopt the same EOC software as the County to enhance coordination. The city tested emergency messaging, with the County operating as a backup if needed. A formal after-action report was written and submitted to the Oregon Office of Emergency Management.
- September Full Scale Exercise Albany Train yard Hazmat The LEPC facilitated a full-scale exercise. A mock rail car derailed, requiring the regional hazmat team and firefighters to work to contain the release. The EOC was notified of the incident and coordinated emergency messaging and resource coordination. A formal after-action was written and submitted to the Oregon Office of Emergency Management.
- *Iron OR 2024* Benton County Emergency Management hosted a Cascadia Earthquake EOC exercise. Linn County EM staff filled in the Operations Section during the 8-hour exercise. An after action is being drafted. The exercise demonstrated the strong partnership and interoperability between Benton and Linn Emergency Management staff.

Training: County emergency management staff are required to participate in 20 hours of training each year. Additionally, they help coordinate training for partner organizations to meet the National Incident Management System (NIMS) requirements. Below is a list of training from 2024.

- *FEMA Planning Section Chief* 40 hours of training helped emergency management staff enhance their incident planning skills and coordination.
- *ICS 300 and 400* In coordination with Benton County, supervisors from various first responder agencies were sent to this incident management training, which is required by NIMS and involves 40 hours of total training time.

Closing: The activities outlined in this yearly overview do not include the 61 SAR missions, SAR trainings, and SAR exercises. The success of both programs is due to the strong support from county leadership and the staffing provided.
